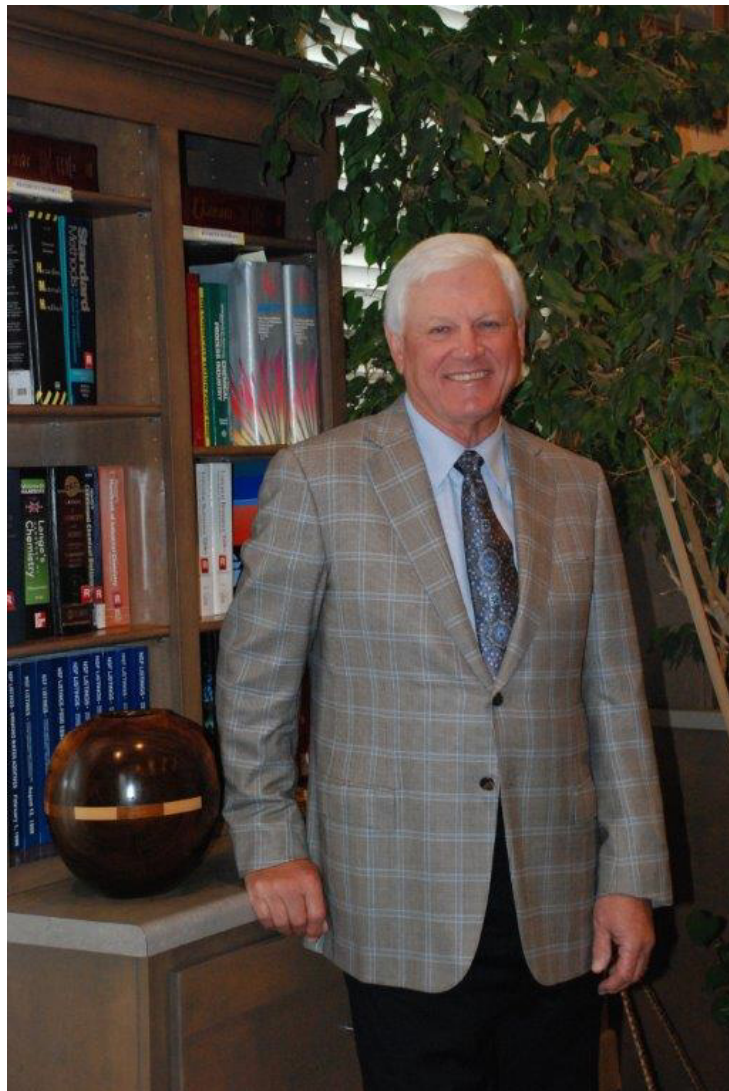


MILTON SUNDBECK

Milton Sundbeck is the President and CEO of Southern Ionics Incorporated, a manufacturer of specialty inorganic chemicals based on aluminum, magnesium, sulfur, ammonia, and zirconium chemistry.

Milton Sundbeck was born on January 23, 1945, in Austin, Texas, and received his chemistry education at the University of Texas. He was first employed with Hercules, Inc. and American Cyanamid before founding Southern Ionics in 1980 in Mobile, Alabama. In 1982, the corporate headquarters moved to downtown West Point.

The company sells over 150 million dollars annually of products which are used to refine diesel and gasoline, manufacture paper, paint, soap, purify water, and control emissions from power and industrial furnaces.



In addition to the corporate office being located in West Point, the first plant location was also built in West Point. SII employs over 280 employees at its ten manufacturing facilities located in Mississippi, Tennessee, Alabama, Georgia, Louisiana, Texas, and Maryland.

SII operates a chemical research and development facility that is located near the Golden Triangle Regional Airport in Lowndes County, which conducts research focused on developing products and manufacturing techniques.

Mr. Sundbeck has two children, Kristen Stevens and Dan Sundbeck, and six grandchildren: Anne, Jeb, and John Willis Stevens, who live in West Point, Mississippi; Daniel Sundbeck who lives in Wilmington, North Carolina; and Sally and Sam Sundbeck, who live in Fairhope, Alabama.

Mr. Sundbeck lives in Clay County with his wife, Christy, and two stepchildren, Larkin and Barry White. In his free time, he raises Brangus and Ultrablack bulls and is looking forward to his first annual cattle auction on Saturday, October 19, 2013 at Town Creek Farm in West Point.
